Dear Friends

'Your Majesty, as children of the Kingdom of God we welcome you in the name of the King of Kings,' said Samuel Strachan, Child of His Majesty's Chapel Royal.

The King replies: 'In His name and after His example I come not to be served but to serve.'

Well, did you watch it – and what a wonderful truth to open the Coronation Service of King Charles III; and how awesome that this spectacular Service with the King making the proclamation of his coronation was broadcast across the planet!

With its pomp and pageantry, the Coronation might seem arcane and irrelevant, but it's a ceremony intended to bind king, people, and Christ together by means of covenantal promises.

There was great theatre, majestic musical composition, and ceremony – led in parts by costumed men with unfathomable heraldic titles – and those in key roles didn't just bear witness but played their part in the re-enactment of covenantal promises found in the Bible and repeated through British history for more than 1,000 years.

In the echoes of history and pageant, a central gospel message resounded: the confession by Britain's political order that Christ is Lord marked a renewed submission to the Lamb of God's heavenly reign, to which all temporal power is limited, contingent and accountable.

When listening to King Charles, affirm The Oaths, especially after receiving 'the Gospel of God as a Rule for the whole life and government of Christian Princes,' and being told to 'receive this Book, the most valuable thing that this world affords. Here is Wisdom; this is the royal Law; these are the lively Oracles of God,' I was reminded of the Oaths and Vows I made when Priested by Bishop Michael.

Not long afterwards, I received a very special letter from a dear clergy friend, Fr Tim Raphael – I quote:

'Having been priested for over 50 years I can only define priesthood as the Gift of God for which I must learn to be grateful. His gift reaches me at every level. Much will be expected of you. You will be expected to be wise and generous, kind and dependable. You will have to teach others and help them to be able to forgive and show compassion to others. You are a representative of Jesus, one who is a servant and trained to be a special kind of leader. You will be a real priest, one who is in the hands of God and is available to change people. We have been given so much, so much to be grateful for and all the better to enjoy the Gift given us.'

Such wise and encouraging words and much to pray for.

As we recall, the words of Jesus were the bedrock of faith for the late Queen Elizabeth II, and she spoke about how, 'the teachings of Christ had served as 'my inner light' and how in Jesus, 'God sent into the world a unique person – neither a philosopher nor a general, but a Saviour, with the power to forgive.' 'For me,' she stated, 'the life of Jesus Christ...is an inspiration and anchor in my life.'

Today we pray for our King, that Jesus Christ will indeed be an inspiration and anchor in his life, **and in ours**; and we pray with him, for a nation united and rejoicing in its diversity, and, ultimately, for a world healed and reconciled in the eternal banquet of the saints in heaven.

Likewise, let us pray for ourselves, our villages, our school and the Tewkesbury and Winchcombe Deanery, as new Clergy join the team. As we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit [28th May], and Trinity Sunday, [4th June] may we live always within the breath of Jesus Christ, receiving life from him on our life's journeys. Julia x
