#### HAPPY EASTER SEASON

Dear Friends

As I write I hear on the news 'over 130 people killed in a shooting in Russia; the Princess of Wales, has cancer; the funeral of two 15 years boys who had been shot, has recently taken place.' 'Humanity against humanity!'

'The world is looking for a saviour – the world needs a saviour – you and I need a saviour!' The Canadian musician, Lights, expresses this in the lyrics of her song 'Saviour.'

'The night is deafening, when the silence is listening, and I'm down on my knees, and I know that something is missing...... Sooner than later, I'll need a saviour, I'll need a saviour...

Lecrae [Moore] is a rapper, entrepreneur, record-producer, and actor. He speaks for many of us when he says, 'I'm not a Christian because I'm strong and have it all together. I'm a Christian because I'm weak and admit I need a saviour.'

The amazing truth of Christianity is that in Jesus you/we do have a saviour.

I love the song written by Ben Fielding and Reuben Morgan that celebrates this salvation – I quote: 'Saviour, He can move the mountains, my God is mighty to save, forever, author of salvation, he rose and conquered the grave, Jesus conquered the grave!'

Jesus is the saviour of the world. At Christmas time, we read in Luke 2 vs 11 'The Angel had announced the birth of a 'Saviour.' During this Easter Season, having journeyed with Jesus through Lent, Passiontide, Holy Week, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday to that Glorious Easter morning, we celebrate Jesus Christ risen from the grave, offering you and I forgiveness of sins and eternal life.

I was chatting recently with Tom, whilst he was doing the garden – 'people' he said, 'seem to have lost the desire for eternal life.' An interesting point to reflect on. I know that I haven't, have you?

I also recently read an article written by Kate Orson, on the Olympic swimmer, Stephanie Rice, and her recent coming to faith in Jesus. I was quite surprised like Kate, at the hostility Stephanie received on her Instagram, because of this. I quote Kate:

'So many people have rejected God because they think Christianity is just a belief system for people that need some kind of spiritual comfort,' says Kate Orson, reflecting on the response to Stephanie Rice giving God glory for her blessings in life. She says we need to work on translating Jesus to those people, so they don't discard him.

In a brave Instagram post Stephanie, shared her conversion story. She describes how 'The few weeks before turning to God were my lowest yet. I can't tell you how broken I was.

That's when I knew I had to do something different, and I had to surrender it all to God. He saved me. He is putting all the pieces back together again in the most beautiful way. At times it's painful, but I know it will be beautiful. God has already blessed my life so richly and I'm excited to see where He takes me next.'

Reading the comments to Stephanie, made me reflect on how we as Christians have work to do, to share the Gospel, and learn as much as we can about the factual evidence for Jesus's life, death, and resurrection to talk with others.

As the apostle Paul says in 1 Corinthians, 'the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.'

I was pleasantly surprised when watching Song of Praise, for Palm Sunday, it was said, thousands upon thousands have come to faith by watching the Passion play enacted out on the streets in various towns on Palm Sunday. It's telling the 'Jesus story' in both a human and spiritual way.

Let's pray for Stephanie and all new Christians, that they be strengthened against the haters, and the persecution that inevitably comes in the life of a Christian, especially on social media. And let's pray for all their followers, that they might hear the Gospel on their posts, and perceive it not as folly but truth. Likewise, let's pray for ourselves that we are enabled to sow the seed of Christ to all the people we encounter in our lives, through our words and actions.

And on that note please continue to hold in love and to pray for Mark, Oliver and Amy Goodwin, as they prepare to say a final farewell to Josie. She gave so much to so many and was an inspirational Christian. A courageous woman of faith.

Throughout this Easter season and beyond, may you all daily be reminded of the **transforming love** of God that he has for each one of us.
