Come ye thankful people, come, raise the song of harvest home.

Dear Friends

As I type, with the TV on in the background, they are already talking about planting for next spring! I don't know about you, but I do like the drawing in of the evenings through the autumnal months; I also enjoy the vibrant autumnal colours in the trees and in the countryside.

Autumn seems to find the church waking up again to PCC meetings, some run Alpha courses, discipleship groups all getting going after a summer break and of course we hold our Harvest services and plan for Remembrance Sunday, Advent and Christmas. So many opportunities to present the good news of Jesus and to grow as his disciples.

It strikes me there is one further thing the drawing in of the evenings can underline and that is our hope is in the greater light, the Light that St John tells us is coming into the world. This Light of course is Jesus, and the theme of Light is always strong at Christmas; yet on our darkening autumnal evenings perhaps we can be encouraged to know that Jesus is the light which cannot be extinguished, that darkness cannot put out.

This teaching reminds us that Jesus, the focus of our celebrations at Christmas and Easter is also a light through the day-to-day routine of life, not just the best days, but also the normal days and the difficult days, and those of us who are followers may we seek to walk in this light all the days of our life and reflect it to family and neighbours every day. I pray that those of you who are not followers will eventually come to see the Light that is Christ.

Reflecting on this season of Harvest, the traditional British Harvest Festival emerged in Victorian times in Cornwall but in fact it has been variously marked for millennia going back to pre-Christian times. Christians have a profound sense of God the Creator engaging with his creatures and Creation in daily life and work, and our Harvest hymns capture this well and additionally remind us that our own lives are meant to become a harvest of growing faith and kindness to all. Harvest has a universal appeal, and it's also marked in many different cultures.

Celebrating Harvest is somehow deeply embedded in human lives and although few of us are directly involved in agriculture in modern Britain, Harvest has an abiding importance. We remain conscious of the impact of the environment on harvesting food, not only changing farming practices but influencing what we now sow as crops because of climate change. Food miles make us aware of the need to procure foods without harming the world's environment.

The joyful delights of harvest celebrations are coupled with a growing awareness of those who experience food poverty, drought and famine which have been present across the world ever since agriculture developed. Thanksgiving for what we have and generosity to those who lack life's basics is as vital today as ever it was.

Three of our parishes have marked the harvest Festival, with Dumbleton celebrating Harvest on Sunday 5th October. Harvest is a time for everyone to mark with reflection, thanksgiving and generosity, exercised with imagination and knowledge of what it means in the 21st Century. Come ye thankful people, come, raise the song of harvest home.

As we continue our journey through the Autumnal months may the gift of God's Holy Spirit fill our hearts, homes and our families with love and peace; and as I've said in previous newsletters, please continue to pray for each other, for the Church, our communities and all nations especially those experiencing conflict, war and famine, and pray that Christ's love, peace and unity might prevail throughout our beautiful God given world.
